Pastor's Perspective

I love the change of seasons. Despite my sister, who lives in Savannah, peppering me with weather reports in January (Tom, "we have six inches of snow and its six degrees here." Laura, "it's sixty today in Savannah"); I love fall and spring and would dearly miss these seasons.

With fall comes a change of routine. We mow and mulch more leaves than grass. We replace summer flowers in outside pots with hardier plants like mums. We may decorate the insides of our houses for the season. We prepare for yet another time change and less time in the evening to enjoy the great outdoors.

We learn to love pumpkin flavored foods again and hot drinks (like cider) to replace cold drinks. We prepare for an onslaught of miniature goblins and witches at our door on Halloween night. We might even watch a scary movie or two (though none in our house, thanks). Fall brings change and that is a good thing for us to experience.

As we change our flowers, our decorations, our clocks, and our to-do-lists; might we also consider some spiritual change? Might we consider adding five minutes of prayer time at the end of the day, it will be too dark to be outside!! Might we consider serving our community in some capacity with 2-3 hours per month? CONTACTLESS SHOEBOX PICKUP AND DROP-OFF

Samaritans Purse has once again recommended that churches practice social distancing as much as possible in distributing shoeboxes, collecting them, and also during National Collection Week.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Read information in the boxes before you pack

Boxes may be picked up beginning Oct. 10th in the narthex. Please sign your name on the sheet on the table along with the number of boxes that you take.

Return Boxes between October 17th - Nov. 7th! The last day to return boxes is Nov. 7th! Please put a sticky note on your boxes with your name on it and cross your name off the list when you return them. Thank you!

ADHESIVE LABELS - No taping is needed! These labels will already be on the shoeboxes, so all you have to do is mark either BOY or GIRL and the age of the child that you are packing your box for.

SHIPPING COST: \$9.00 per box - Please read information inside the box concerning multiple ways that you can pay for your boxes.

Rubber Bands - Place 2 rubber bands around your box.

Pray for the child/children who will be receiving your shoeboxes that they will receive Jesus as their Lord and Savior!

Have fun packing your shoeboxes knowing that you will give each child **GREAT JOY** by taking the time to pick out special items that you would be proud to give your own child or grandchildren.

Thank you for being obedient and for allowing God to use you in such a mighty way!
